## **CFI Offers Bracing Relief**

Arthritis pain can severely restrict one's enjoyment of life. When relief is provided, the change can be quick and dramatic.

"I remember one very avid golf player, about 55 or 60 years old, who came in with excruciating pain just from the arthritis and over-use of the knee. We fit him with a custom osteoarthritis (OA) brace, and as soon as he started walking around the office in it, he experienced immediate pain relief," said Kathy Smith, C.O., L.O., CFI Prosthetics Orthotics.

Some of these cases can be as rewarding for the orthotist as for the patient. An improved level of function opens up a future with greater potential for more active

enjoyment of daily life activities—at both work and play.

"You don't always have that level of success every time," Smith cautioned, "but that particular brace we used unloads a specific compartment of the knee, relieving pressure, and allows the patient to again become as mobile as possible, as quickly as possible."

Although arthritis can affect individuals of any age, even juveniles, Smith's patients are primarily adults and geriatrics. By the time an individual has reached geriatric status, Smith explained, their joints are already in the process of debilitating, and her job at CFI allows her to provide and fit an appropriate therapeutic and supportive brace.

Most CFI patients arrive with their orthotic prescriptions from their orthopedist or other physician, but Smith often sees walkin clients who saw someone wearing a knee brace at the grocery store and thought such a device might help them, too.

"We talk with them and try to identify the brace, evaluate their situation, and direct them to a doctor that may be able to prescribe the appropriate orthotic solution for them. As practitioners we cannot prescribe, but we can suggest to the doctor what might be the best orthotic."

Arthritis sufferers may also benefit from extra-depth shoes also worn by individuals with diabetes, Smith adds. The deeper interior of the shoe allows the practitioner to make comfort adjustments, especially for those patients who have toe deformities. Shoes with neoprene tops can also alleviate painful rubbing and possible blisters.
